I am a fan and collector of the new fancy leaved coral bells. I like their attractive foliage, but have missed their outstanding flowers. Plum Pudding gives you both attractive foliage and good looking flowers on one plant. The silvery, plum-purple foliage displays wiry-stemmed sprays of tiny, pink, bell-shaped flowers in June. This compact variety of Heuchera is known for having the darkest foliage. It is ideal for the front of the perennial border, in the rock garden, woodland garden, as edging along winding paths and walkways, or in containers. Grow in rich, well-drained soil in part sun to part shade. Feed with a liquid or slow release fertilizer. This plant is hardy in zone 4.
