## Thymus serpyllum 'Pink Chintz' (thi'mus) CREEPING THYME

GROUNDCOVER

I like the spicy fragrance that is released as you step onto the mat-forming foliage of this thyme. The fuzzy, olive green leaves create a luscious carpet that is smothered with tiny, salmon-pink flowers in May to July. Shear back the faded flowers to keep the plant neat and tidy. Pink Chintz is one of the first thymes to flower and one of the most tolerant of dry conditions. It makes a delightful groundcover for the front of the perennial border, herb garden, or rock garden. Use it as a filler between stepping stones or allow it to sprawl over the sides of rock ledges and containers. This thyme attracts butterflies to the garden. Plant it in full to part sun in average, well-drained soil. It is hardy in Zone 3.
