## Campsis radicans 'Monba' BALBOA SUNSET® TRUMPET CREEPER

This vine was discovered growing wild on Balboa Island, California and is named for its velvety-red and orange sunset-hued flowers. The tubular, 3 to 4 inch flowers attract hummingbirds in abundance and bloom in clusters for a dramatic show from late spring through fall. Trumpet vines need a strong structure for support and are ideal as a screen on lattice and arbors, or as a groundcover for covering large areas. To keep this fast growing plant under control, prune young vines in late winter to early spring to fit your support structure. On established vines, prune back the side shoots to within 3 or 4 buds of the main framework; prune overcrowded shoots as needed. Avoid high nitrogen fertilizers or you may have plenty of foliage with no flowers. Balboa Sunset® is late to emerge in spring and thrives in full sun in moist, well-drained to dry soil. It is hardy in Zones 4-11.
