I have found Lavender Lady to be one of the most fragrant of all lilacs. This variety will add a spicy, sweet essence to warm, spring evenings in your backyard. Rich green, heart-shaped foliage displays small, tubular flowers that grow in dense, conical-shaped clusters in spring. These massive panicles may even become so heavy in flower that the branches can become pendulous with the weight! The lavish, lavender colored blooms make spectacular cut flowers and will attract both butterflies and hummingbirds to your garden. I have always liked to use the open branched, upright form of lilacs as an accent plant in mixed shrub borders or as a hedge or screen in mass plantings with other lilacs. These bushes can live for hundreds of years and date back to the 1750s in the United States. Lilacs are fast growers that thrive in a full sun location with good air circulation and well-drained soil. To conserve moisture and improve the soil, apply a 2-3" layer of mulch or organic material. Lavender Lady is hardy in Zones 3 to 8 and should only be pruned after it is done flowering.
