

We are focusing on Plant Selection and Combinations, but I thought this information may be helpful as you plant and care for your container gardens this season.

A FEW BASIC TIPS AND TRICKS

THE CONTAINER

- Pot with drainage holes
- Material influences soil moisture and temperature
 - Plastic and glazed pots soil dries less quickly than terra cotta pots
- Bigger the pot, slower soil dries
- Use weatherproof container when growing outdoors year-round
- Double pot when:
 - Using decorative containers without drainage holes
 - Overwintering containers in the garden
 - Plastic pot in cocoa mat pot to help retain soil moisture
 - Budget wise hide grower pot with plants in decorative containers
 - Set pot with drainage holes inside container without drainage holes
 - Add pebbles to bottom of the decorative pot to elevate the pot with drainage holes above any water that collects in the bottom
- Moving the pot
 - Strong friends until they catch on and disappear
 - Wheeled plant caddy
 - Pot Lifter
- False bottoms
 - Ups-a-Daisy, Better than Rocks
 - DIY use landscape fabric over crushed cans, bottles...
- Upcycled Containers

DESIGN TIPS

- Container is focus, plants are secondary
- Plants are the focus and pots are less noticeable
- Pots and plants command equal attention

SELECT A QUALITY PLANTING MIX

- Retains moisture, yet drains
- Most contain a combination of some or all of these:
 - Peat moss
 - Compost
 - o Coir
 - Rice hulls
 - Vermiculite
 - Perlite
 - o Bark

FERTILIZATION

- Slow-release at planting and once midsummer, if needed
- Or, soluble mixed and applied at watering

WATERING

- Check daily and water thoroughly when top few inches start to dry
- Mulch
- Self-watering pots
- Papyrus, Canna, Elephant Ears in pot without drainage
- Plant Nannies and Aqua Cones
- Wool Pellets sustainable and organic, reduce watering by 20%
- Collect rainwater in rain barrels (use on ornamental plants) or warm up water from the shower
- Container irrigation systems with timer

SELECT PLANTS THAT REQUIRE THE SAME GROWING CONDITIONS TO REDUCE MAINTENANCE AND INCREASE SUCCESS

Utility-friendly Tree Planting Tips from We Energies

Trees growing too close to power lines can cause sparks, fires, power outages and shock hazards. To avoid these problems, plant trees that won't interfere with power lines when fully grown. Small ornamental trees or shrubs that will not exceed 15 feet in height such as serviceberry, dogwood and low-growing evergreens are best to plant around power lines. Trees such as maple, basswood, burr oak, white pine or spruce grow more than 40 feet high and should be planted more than 50 feet from any overhead power lines.

And don't forget to call 811 at least three days before planting to check the location of underground services.

Landscaping Around We Energies Utilities

Plants and other landscaping features can interfere with utility equipment and cause safety risks. Remember to:

Maintain equipment visibility: Use techniques that camouflage rather than hide utility equipment. Hearty grasses and/or flowers are preferred. They provide aesthetic improvements and grow back quickly should equipment access be necessary.

Ensure easy access: When fencing is used, choose a split-rail type, which can be easily dismantled when equipment access is needed. Be sure fences are located more than 3 feet from transformer sides and no permanent fence post is located in front of transformer door.

Keep proper clearance: When woody shrubs or bushes are used, place them more than 3 feet from transformer sides and more than 10 feet from its door. Keep future growth in mind for the size of shrubs or bushes.

DON'T HARM THE TREES FOR FLOWERS

- Pots set among perennial flowers and groundcovers
- Bury several nursery pots in soil under tree
 - Pot up flowers in a slightly smaller pot
 - Set the smaller pot in the buried pot
 - This means less digging
 - Less root disturbance, so better for the trees
 - Potting soil doesn't dry out as quickly
