

USES IN THE LANDSCAPE

- Add color and interest where no planting space is available
- Focal point, vertical accents in landscape or planting bed
- Soften structure
- Screening
- Create outdoor living spaces large and small
- Problem solving
- Easier access to plants
 - Easier access for planting, maintenance and harvesting
 - Bring the garden to your back door and party
- Attract pollinators
- Small scale water, bog or desert garden
 - Water garden planting mix (less organic matter for water gardens), top with stones
 - Bog garden (80% coarse peat, 20% sharp sand)
 - Succulents (cacti and succulent mix or 1:1 potting mix and perlite or...)
- Save the trees

- Front steps filled with planters
- Coleus on shelves next to front door
- Alternanthera and Impatiens
- Pots of pansies on railing
- By garage
 - Left Cordyline, Fountain Grass, Silver Falls Dichondra, Rieger & Rex Begonias
 - Right Cordyline, Fiber Optic Grass, Coleus, Oxalis
- Hostas in blue pots mark entrance to stairs
- Patio filled with tropicals for a paradise retreat
- o Container of Impatiens and Coleus mimic plants in surrounding bed, providing unity
- Garage roof garden
 - Always check structural strength to hold weight of container, moist soil and mature plants
- Rooftop garden willows in Smart Pots form living dome
- o Palm, Nicotiana, Diamond Frost Euphorbia and Coleus provides vertical interest in garden bed
- o Fountain with Bromeliads and Spanish Moss on left
 - 3-tier planter with AquaSav Coco Mat filled with Petunias
- Thalia or Gartenmeister Fuchsia and Variegated Sedge
 - 3-tier planter filled with variegated sedge
- Pots on multiple height posts with Calibrachoa and Geranium



- Edible flowers
 - Nasturtium leaves and flowers dress up salad

- Cardinal Vine with Hummingbird
- Cigar Plant (Cuphea) in old tea kettle
- Cigar Plant with Baby Tut Papyrus and Golden Moneywort
- Pentas and Strobilanthes
- Black and Bloom Salvia (also Black & Blue, Wendy's Wish)
- Rockin' Fuchsia Salvia with Lacinato Kale and Asian Garden Celosia
- Lantana tree form
- Zahara Sunburst Zinnia
- Pansies and Alyssum
- Stocks and Pansies

FRAGRANCE

- Sweet Alyssum in basket
- Evening Scentsation Petunia
- Heliotrope and Parsley (Swallowtail caterpillar favorite)
- Creeping Rosemary in round glazed pot

SUCCULENTS

- Collection in pot set in garden
- Repurpose broken pots for added interest and color in succulent container
- Serving tray of succulents
- Sedum in repurposed hanging item
- Collection of Echeverias and Hens and Chicks in low round pot
- Stacked containers of succulents
- Potted succulents on window shelf
- Hanging basket of succulents
- Open terrariums of succulents under umbrella

TROPICALS

- Rubber Tree and Golden Moneywort
- Palm, Fern, Calathea, and Impatiens
- Bromeliads and more in wall garden
- Aechmea 'Yellow Berries', Rio Grande Portulaca, Bromeliads and Fan Palm

WATER & BOG GARDENS

- Canna, Curly Rush, Houttuynia, Colocasia, Pitcher Plant
- Pitcher Plants
- Pitcher Plant and Golden Moneywort in trough

PERENNIALS

- Foliage container
- Hosta and Hakonachloa Grass
- Heuchera and Impatiens

TREES & SHRUBS

- One zone hardier if left outdoors year-round
- Japanese Maple with Phormium, Impatiens, Variegated Plectranthus, Golden Moneywort, Pumpkins and decorative Squash
- Citrus bring indoors in areas where it's not hardy
- Little Lamb and other Panicle Hydrangeas
- Tiger Eyes Sumac, Smokebush, Jewels of Opar, Wire Vine
- Weeping Blue Atlas Cedar, Scented Geraniums and Vinca
- Evergreen miniatures Chamaecyparis and Spruce

BULBS

- Hardy
 - Daffodils and Grape Hyacinths
 - Tulips with Pansies and greens
 - Hardy Lilies
- Summer Bulbs non hardy for many
 - Alocasia and Caladium
 - o Canna, Croton, Coleus, Scaevola
 - o Dahlia, Coleus, Bidens
 - Peacock Lily
 - Gloriosa Lily

FAIRY, GNOME & ZOMBIE GARDENS A FEW BASIC TIPS & TRICKS

THE CONTAINER

- Pot with drainage holes
- Material influences soil moisture and temperature
- Bigger the pot, slower soil dries
- Weather proof container when growing outdoors year-round
- Double pot
 - For decorative containers without drainage holes
 - When overwintering containers in the garden
 - Plastic pot in cocoa mat pot

- Budget wise hide grower pot with plants in decorative containers
- Moving the pot
 - Strong friends until they catch on and disappear
 - Wheeled plant caddy
 - Pot Lifter
- False bottoms
 - Ups-a-Daisy, Better than Rocks
 - DIY use landscape fabric over crushed cans, bottles...
- Upcycled containers

DESIGN TIPS

- Container is focus kids wagon with Echeveria
- Plants are the focus Fountain Grass, Begonia, Impatiens, Caladium, Ivy
- Complement each other blue pots with Agave and other succulents
- Pot is invisible <u>container of dried landscape material</u> grasses, seedheads...

SELECT A QUALITY PLANTING MIX

- Retains moisture, yet drains
- Most contain a combination of some or all of these:
 - Peat moss
 - Compost
 - o Coir
 - Rice hulls
 - Vermiculite
 - o Perlite
 - o Bark

FERTILIZATION

- Slow-release at planting
- Or soluble mixed and applied at watering

WATER

- Check daily and water thoroughly when top few inches start to dry
- Mulch
- Self-watering pots
- Papyrus, Canna, Elephant Ears in pot without drainage
- Plant Nannies and Aqua Cones
- Wool Pellets sustainable and organic, reduce watering by 25%
- Collect rain water in rain barrels or warm up water from shower
- Container irrigation systems with timer
- DIY

PLANT SELECTION

- Require the same growing conditions
 - Fuchsia, Impatiens, Begonia, Streptocarpus
- Plant, container and surrounding in scale
 - Morning Glory on support, Papyrus, Petunia, Zinnia, Lantana, Asparagus Fern

BASIC DESIGN IDEA

- Thriller, Filler and Spiller a place to start if needed
 - Hibiscus, Pennisetum, Walkabout Sunset Lysimachia and garden art
- Color
 - Warm colors of red, yellow and orange create focal point, warming
 - Cool blues, green and violets calming, cooling and less intense
- Color echoing and texture
 - Trough with silver echoed, fine and bold texture
 - Succulents in its own pot of succulent mix set into container of potting mix
 - Begonias and Silver Falls Dichondra

LANDSCAPE MAKEOVERS WITH CONTAINERS

- Deck Screening
 - Boxwood elevated on overturned nursery pots
 - Black Lace Elderberry in front
 - Burlap wrap masks the mechanics
 - Front row colorful self-watering pots with Shenandoah Switchgrass
- End of Drive
 - Area rug covers cracks, outdoor table and chairs provide focal point and seating
 - Bananas, Mums, Geraniums, Cardinal Vines and more in individual pots

NON PLANT VERTICAL ELEMENTS

- Garden art
- Metal swirls
- Bamboo poles and dowel rods
- Colorful Dogwood and Birch or Contorted Willow twigs
- Dried material Eucalyptus, Lotus pods, twigs

EXTEND THE SEASON

- Move containers in and out as needed
- Row covers, cloches, and Wall-o-Waters
- Overwintering
 - Move indoors and grow as houseplant
 - o Take cuttings smaller plants, less risk of bringing in pests
 - o Save tubers, corms
 - Canna
 - Caladium
 - Dahlia
 - Banana
 - Some can go semi dormant in cool, dark location
 - Mandevilla
 - Let them die a quick death with the first frost
 - Give to a friend, then buy new plants

- Overwintering hardy plants
 - Grow plants at least one zone hardier in weather-proof pot, if left outside unprotected
 - Plant in the garden and buy new ones next year
 - Bury pot in vacant space in the garden to insulate the roots
 - Keep in unheated garage in insulating material
 - Water whenever soil is thawed and dry
 - Place together in sheltered location, cover with wood chips or other item

DON'T KILL THE TREES FOR FLOWERS

- Pot set amongst perennial flowers and groundcovers
- Washtub with Thalia Fuchsia, Begonia, Streptocarpus and Impatiens
- Pot with various Begonias and Coleus
- Hostas in terra cotta pots
- Pots of Impatiens in Ajuga groundcover
- Bury several nursery pots in soil under tree plant slightly smaller pot of flowers and set in the buried pot - less digging, better for you and the tree

A FEW MORE PLANTS TO TRY

- Little Zin Hibiscus, Flame Thrower Coleus, Spotlight Lime Sweet Potato Vine
- Moss
- Under the Sea Coleus in shell-shaped planter
- Dragon Wing, Whopper or Big Red Begonia with Licorice Vine
- Canary Wing Begonia with Elephant Ears and Golden Moneywort
- Crested Celosia and Curly Rush
- Mexican Flame Vine with Rudbeckia, Lantana, Zinnia, and Blackie Sweet Potato Vine
- Verbena bonariensis
- Fireworks Fountain Grass, Strawflower, Sedges
- Mighty Velvet Stachys, Coleus, Verbena
- Golf Beauty Drumstick Flower, Verbena, Petunia

- Gaura, Trailing Verbena
- Morning Glory, Papyrus, Zinnias, Vines
- Hyacinth Bean Vine, Verbena, Alternanthera, Sedge
- Solar Tower Sweet Potato Vine, Parsley, Salvia, Impatiens
- Mandevilla and Dipladenia with Celosia, Oxalis
- Snake Plant with Illumination Vinca Vine
- Kent Beauty Ornamental Oregano in teapot

GET CREATIVE

- Bidens as "coneflower"
- Black-eyed Susan Vine
- Greens in colander
- Purse planters and ladder of pots (anchor securely)
- Birdcage vertical accent Gaura, Petunias, Geraniums
- <u>Stacked centerpiece</u> made from saucers and overturned pots
- <u>Living chess board</u> Ajuga and Spanish Moss
- Built-in planting areas in table
- Topiary living container Ornamental Cabbage, Begonia, Wire Vine
- Chair planter filled with succulents
- Painted bike
- Coffee urn with Fountain Grass, Lotus Vine
- Leaky birdbath and Golden Moneywort, Impatiens
- Toy truck Wire Vine and Petunia
- Wheelbarrow filled with Wax Begonia
- Pumpkin with Ornamental Pepper
- Painted coffee cans with Annual Vinca, Pansies
- Ruler planter filled with Pansies
- Corsican Mint with golf ball on tee

VERTICAL ACCENTS

- Spike the traditional, but now lots of new cultivars
- Phormium, Banana, Canna, Elephant Ears, Hibiscus, Papyrus, other tropicals
- Purple Majesty Millet, Verbena bonariensis, Sparkler Cleome, Sunflowers, Snapdragons, Stock and other spiky annuals
- Fountain Grass, Ornamental Grasses and Variegated Bamboo
- Russian Sage, Cimicifuga (Bugbane), Variegated Solomon's Seal, Palm Sedge, Gaura, Acorus and other perennials
- Bronze fennel, Dill, Lovage and other herbs
- Corn, Swiss Chard, Onions and Garlic, Beans and Cucumbers,
 Pole Beans or Peas on a trellis, Ornamental Mustard, Kale,
 Tomato, Pepper and Eggplant
- Topiary and Dwarf Evergreens
- Dappled Willow, Red Twig Dogwood and other deciduous trees and shrubs
- Vines on obelisk or trellis Solar Tower Sweet Potato Vine, Hyacinth Bean, Morning Glory, Spanish Flag (Mina lobata), Canary and Cardinal Vine, Clematis and tropicals (Mandevilla)
- Branches forced for spring, colorful for winter, height for summer
- Bulbs give 'em a chill and then move to outdoor container

SPILLERS

- Vinca the traditional or one of the newer cultivars like Illumination
- Dichondra 'Silver Falls', Golden Moneywort or Licorice Vine, Deadnettle (Lamium maculatum)
- Trailing annuals, like Calibrachoa, Trailing Petunias, Scaevola...
- Sweet Potato Vine, Lotus Vine
- Creeping Rosemary, Oregano, Mint, Nasturtium, Sage, Strawberries
- Ivies, Giant Purple Inch Plant, Wandering Jew, Spider Plants,
 Philodendron and other trailing houseplants

FILLERS

- Variegated Sage, Parsley, Basil...
- Annuals, of course
 Change out for the season, ie. Pansies
- Lettuce, Spinach, Beets, Radishes, and other ornamental vegetables
- Calendula, Pansies, Nasturtiums and other edible flowers
- Fragrant Heliotrope, Alyssum
- Bird and butterfly appeal Verbena, Pentas, Cupheas
- Houseplants Ferns, Begonias, Polka Dot Plant...
- Coral Bells, Geranium, Threadleaf Coreopsis and other perennials
- Small annual and perennial Ornamental Grasses and Sedges
- Greens for winter

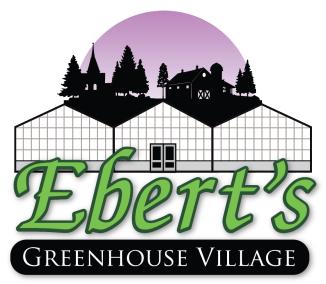
